ITINERARY



Thursday (13th):

- 2pm+ Jersey International Air Festival. Commences circa 2pm and culminates with the Red Arrows at 4pm. Planes fly across St Aubins Bay. Focus of display will be West Park, western side of St Helier.
- 6pm+ (Weather permitting) Meet at the Steam Clock in St Helier for an evening ride to catch the sunset at St Ouens. Followed by a meal * at the Watersplash, St Ouens (ordered before set off).

Friday (14th):

- 10am+ Registration for the rally will be available at Jersey Harley Davidson, Georgetown.
- 12pm+ Opportunity to ride to and from a Jersey landmark (Durrell Park / Battery Moltke – German bunker) (*)
- 12pm+ SPECIAL INVITATION to Nigel Mansell's Motor Museum (*)
- 6pm + Gathering at the Troubadour Pub on Weighbridge Place, St Helier (vests allowed) to socialise with other rally participants.

Saturday (15th):

- 9am+ registration is available all day at Jersey Harley Davidson, Georgetown.
- 10am + meet up at the waterfront, an area in front of Royal Yacht Hotel, Weighbridge Place. Various rides will take place around the island finishing at a Pub for a light lunch. Details will be available upon registration.
- 12.30pm + lunch * at several venues. Details available upon registration.
- 2pm + after lunch, we will all ride from our lunch venues to Corbiere Point via St Ouens Bay, which will take approximately 30 minutes. At Corbiere Point, the local WWII society has agreed to open one of the extensive German bunkers for us all to wander around (foc).
- 4pm + we will ride back via the countryside to Liberation Square in St Helier, a journey that will take approximately 40 minutes. (The more direct route is 15 minutes.)
- 7pm + THE Bar, the Waterfront in St Helier where we will lay on a buffet for all of our guests.
- 9.00pm+ THE Bar, we have arranged for music from about 9:00pm until midnight.

Sunday (16th):

- 9am + the big ride around the island: we will leave the front of the Royal Yacht Hotel, Weighbridge Place at 10.30am precisely. We would suggest that you arrange to be there by 10am (if not slightly earlier) to enjoy the atmosphere. Judging will take place at this time for the 3 prizes; dirtiest, best / custom and furthest ridden. (There may also be another prize.)
- 12 noon+ after the ride, anyone who wishes to do so can leave their bikes in the area in front of the Royal Yacht Hotel and go to one of the numerous bars nearby (ie the Mimosa Bar, the Troubadour etc.).

Please also note that should you wish to go into St Helier on either Friday or Saturday, the area in front of the Royal Yacht is available to any Harley rider for parking (free of charge).
